### **Engineering Preview Day**



#### **Facilities**

- We are moving forward with facility renovations.
   Facilities that are going to be renovated are the Cardio Room and Sea Aggie Fitness Center. Campus Recreation met with Life Fitness to explore new cardio equipment options, and we have a meeting set up with our Marathon Fitness representative to explore their cardio equipment and functional "rigs".
- After participating in a two-week trial, Campus Recreation signed a contract with Pandora's CloudCover for music in the facilities.

- Joe facilitated a Green Dot Overview for Nuerodivergent Student Leaders on Campus on 3/6.
